Bei Problemen/ FAQ

- Das Display startet nicht: Bitte überprüfen Sie die Stromversorgung. Steckt das Kabel des Netzteils richtig im Gerät? Überprüfen Sie bitte auch den Kaltgerätestecker im Netzteil. Bei der Stromversorgung über PoE (Power over Ethernet): Bitte kontrollieren Sie den RJ45 Stecker ob er richtig eingeklickt ist. Das Kabel sollte mindestens Cat5e für Displays bis 15 Zoll und Cat6 für Displays ab 15 Zoll entsprechen um die Leistung zu übertragen. Kontrollieren Sie bitte ob der Switch genügend Leistung zur Verfügung stellt und ob das Display an einem PoE Port angeschlossen ist. Nur Standard konformes PoE darf verwendet werden. Bei passivem PoE kann ihr Display zerstört werden. Hierfür wird keine Garantie übernommen.
- Ich bekomme keine Ethernet/ Internet Verbindung: Bitte schalten Sie das WLAN aus. Schalten Sie die Ethernetverbindung aus und wieder an und kontrollieren Sie die IP Adress-Einstellungen, ob sie eine statische IP eingestellt haben. Die Wlan Verbindung und Bluetooth sollten bei Nichtbenutzung immer auf deaktiviert stehen um Probleme zu vermeiden.
- Updates sind nicht automatisch und über OTA (Over the Air) zu bekommen. Sollten Sie hierzu Fragen haben, bitte auch an den Support wenden.
